

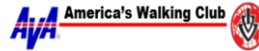

## New 2018 AVA Laser Cut Stamps Passed on by Jerry Wilson, Originally Prepared By a Club in the AVA Atlantic Region

### “New 2018 Laser Cut Stamp

Please note: **Ink the stamp lightly** and do a trial stamp on a piece of paper (e.g., the walk directions) before stamping in your IVV book. The new stamp has shallow characters and is quite flat. It **does not require as much ink or pressure** as the old stamps. Too much ink will result in a smudged imprint.”

We're kicking off our 2018 Group Walk and Eat schedule with - another mall walk. Just when you thought you couldn't get enough mall walking in, we found time to squeeze in another event. The payoff is this one is a Walk and Eat!

We will gather at the **West Towne Mall Food Court on Saturday, February 10 at 8:30 am**, slightly earlier than usual, so that we may beat the shopping crowd. If you plan to walk less than a 10K, feel free to come later. There's no need to go to the Firestone Starting Point to register; we'll have the walk box available in the food court. You can leave your coat and other gear at the start table in the food court and it will be watched while you walk. An early lunch location afterward is to still to be determined, but we'll pick something near the mall.

**Don't Miss Out – March 17 and May 19 & 20

Two of the Dairyland Walkers most popular events are just around the corner and you won't want to miss them by not planning ahead!

First, pie lovers will look forward to our annual Pie Walk starting at St. Luke's Lutheran Church on March 17<sup>th</sup>. We will have a guided 5K walk in the Middleton area followed by Hubbard's Avenue Pie at St. Luke's. Times and sign-up information will be contained in our next newsletter.

In May we will complete our ambitious "Walk Wisconsin Counties" program to the surprise (astonishment?! ) of many. We will walk in Shawano (Shawano County) on Saturday, May 19<sup>th</sup>, with check-in time between 10 am and 1 pm, with all walkers to be finished by 3 pm. We will move north to Antigo to spend the night. A limited number of rooms have been blocked at the Super 8 in Antigo until April 19<sup>th</sup> under the name of Dairyland Walkers. The Super 8's phone number is (715) 623-4188. In an effort to make walks in 2018 more appealing, particularly to new members and those who enjoy walking as a social experience, your board hopes to institute two new initiatives. First, at a time to be designated for each traditional walk, we hope to have a volunteer head up a group walk using the directions for the event. This will NOT be a guided walk, but rather a planned time for a group of walkers to depart the start area. Second, we hope to have a volunteer plan a post-walk get together at a restaurant/watering hole near the start/finish point to gather following the walk for socializing. Both of these efforts will be focused on new walkers, but also designed to include all of our walkers who might be interested. The key to the success of these programs will be having new volunteers step up. It need not be the same individuals each time, but we will need to have new members volunteering.

## New AVA Stamps Require New Stamping Technique – A Message From the AVA National President Passed Along By Jerry Wilson

“On January 1, 2018, we will begin using the new improved stamp at all of our events. With the new stamp comes the need to use a new stamping technique. The attached will be in the next Checkpoint and in the upcoming issue of TAW, but because of the critical nature of the information and the timing of these two publications, it is essential that you share this information with your clubs as soon as possible...

### “NEW STAMPS REQUIRE NEW STAMPING TECHNIQUE

Effective January 1, 2018, all our events will be using the new stamps which will save us money and provide a stamp with more information in our books. This is a great step forward for AVA, but with every improvement/change comes the need to adjust how we do business. These new stamps are no exception. Please be aware that you will need to be careful how you use the new stamps. If you continue to do your stamping like you always have with our old stamps, you could easily end up with just black mark in your books.

In particular, with the old stamps we all tended to press the stamp deeply into the stamp pad and then press the stamp very hard on our books, rocking and rolling the stamp to account for the uneven slugs in the stamp. With the new stamps, this technique could well result in solid black mark since the new stamps do not have letters/numbers as deep as the old stamps, and most the stamps have smaller letters with less space between the letters.

The suggested procedure for the new stamps is to ink the stamp lightly and do a trial stamp on a piece of paper (e.g., the walk directions) to ascertain imprint quality. You may determine that the stamp has too much ink and have to repeat this process to determine the correct amount of force to ink the stamp as well as the correct amount force to use get a good imprint **before** stamping your book.

It is critical that all Volkssporters get the word on changing how they stamp their books. While this is a very positive step forward for AVA, it won't take but one botched stamp in a book to sour that participant on this as an improvement. Clubs might consider putting an instruction sheet in with the stamp in their Walk Box showing both the botched stamp using the old technique and the new improved stamp using the recommended stamping technique.

Thanks to Bob Schmick (Maryland Volkssport Assoc., President) for pointing out this "black line" issue and ATRD, Mike Green for bringing it to my attention. Thanks also to Chris Zegelin for developing this new improved stamp, to Hector Hernandez for learning how to operate the new stamp cutting equipment and getting all these new stamps produced, and the rest of the folks in the office for working together to get the stamps shipped out to the clubs.”

**Members present:** Russ Crane, Karen Reger, Mary Liebig, Kristi Kenyon, Don Suloff, Doug Wiest, Susan Wester, Tom Gundlach, Tricia Gundlach, Terry Wendt, Joanne Reuter

**Call to Order:** The meeting was called to order at 5:57 p.m. by President Wiest. The agenda was approved with the addition of one item in New Business. The minutes of the 13 September 2017 Board meeting were approved as distributed.

**Officer Reports**

**President:** No report.

**Vice President:** Terry Wendt indicated that everything is ready for the December 3 Christmas party at the Goodman Center.

**Secretary:** No report.

**Treasurer:** Kristi Kenyon reported that income for the month was \$248.00. Event income amounted to \$171.00, with sales of \$46.00 and dues and donations of \$31.00. Total expenses were \$270.00, with \$170.00 for administrative costs and \$100.00 for speaker gratuity. The 8 November balance is \$5,003.79, down \$22.00 from the previous month. The report was approved and filed for audit.

**Director at Large:** No report.

**Other Reports**

**Membership Chair:** Mary Liebig proposed some dates for a meeting to get the Blue books ready for mailing. After some discussion, Thursday, December 28 at 9:00 a.m. was chosen. The meeting will be at the Prairie Cafe in Middleton.

Mary also reported that she has received special permission to use the DeForest park shelter at the non-profit rate of \$25 for the April 2018 walk.

**Sanctioned Event Coordinator:** No report.

**Trailmaster:** Don Suloff indicated 2018 walks are in order.. Almost all traditional walks are posted on the website now. The remaining two will be posted soon. Shelters have been reserved where needed. As for the May weekend walk, he was only able to obtain a block of 10 rooms at the Super 8. If the block becomes filled, he suggested using one's own means to receive a discount, such as an AARP card.

**Publicity Chair:** No report.

**Volunteer Coordinator:** Tricia Gundlach said a person to replace her has not yet been located. She will discuss it this week at an Awards committee meeting. Mary added that she may also have some ideas for possible replacements.

Mary also commented that her church has a standing list of activities needing volunteers and wondered whether this would work for Dairyland Walkers. She suggested placing such a list regularly in the newsletter and/or monthly emails.

**Newsletter Editor:** No report.

**Website Administrator:** No report.

**AVA Electronic Sanctioning Volunteer:** Tom Gundlach has completed one fourth quarter report. Several 2018 events are YRE's and won't need special sanctioning, but there are 4-5 others that will need to be done.

**Special Projects:** In an email to Board members, Diane Thornbery reported she would continue to work on the special projects she has started, such as the Blue book, as well as some new ones. However, she does not believe it is necessary for her to attend Board meetings in order to accomplish this.

### Unfinished Business

Newsletter Articles: Mary will remind members to look for the 2018 Blue book and to renew membership. Joanne Reuter will write about trash pickup; Terry, the East and West Towne walks; Don, the pie walk; and Doug, accomplishments. Don questioned whether someone should also write about the new AVA stamps.

Meet-Up: The possibility of the club subscribing to a MeetUp account was discussed, in addition to earlier communication by email. Susan Wester made a motion to register for an account on a trial basis, which she will manage. The merits of the account will be evaluated in six months' time. The motion was seconded and approved. The account will be activated in time for the March 2018 walks.

New Special Program: Russ Crane said that he has been considering the new special program adopted by the Board at the last meeting. It does not appear likely that he will be able to develop it by the end of the year. He wondered if the Board would wish to reconsider some aspects, such as the rewards.

### New Business

Speakers for the February and April 2018 membership meetings: Mary said she would email Jerry Wilson regarding his ability to present the AVA Ice Age Trail program at the February general membership meeting. If the meeting is unable to (be) held on the usual date because of Jerry's schedule, Diane must be notified. For the April speaker, Terry said he will review his notes.

Tentative schedule of Saturday "Walk-and-Eats" for 2018: Mary has emailed a list of future Walk and Eats events to the Board. In creating it, she coordinated the walks so as to avoid conflict with proposed 2018 walks, the Badger schedule, and club meeting dates.

Discussion about declining participant numbers for our walks: Joanne reminded the Board of an earlier email from Jerry containing cumulative walker totals over recent years. The totals revealed that numbers for YRE and seasonal walks are down. Don added that numbers are also down for traditional walks. There was some discussion, including Russ' noting that there are no longer brochures or flyers for each walk, and Joanne's concern about possible correlation with bad weather. It was concluded that numbers should continue to be reviewed, and that perhaps posting walks on MeetUp, as well as creating informal post-walk social gatherings may help.

Input from board members recognizing new volunteers, to be presented at December membership meeting: Tricia said the Awards committee would like to recognize newer volunteers at the Christmas party. She then suggested a couple people to recognize, and asked the Board for more names. She suggested perhaps Don could give a short presentation on how to coordinate a walk.

**Adjournment:** The meeting was adjourned at 7:26 p.m. by President Wiest.
