Every other year the Dairyland Walkers hold a moonlight walk which has become a much-anticipated event. This year we will walk in Middleton's Pheasant Branch Conservancy on Friday evening, October 11<sup>th</sup>, just two days before the full moon. The 10 K walk hikes to the top of a hill with a spectacular view of Lake Mendota and the Capital, passes through the planned neighborhood of Middleton Hills, and finishes on the trails and boardwalks of the Pheasant Branch Conservancy. The 5 K walk completes its entire loop within the Conservancy. Although flashlights are encouraged, some past years we have walked solely by the light of the moon. Hopefully this will again be the case.

This is a guided walk with two start times. The 10 K walkers will leave the start point promptly at 6 pm and 5K walkers will leave the start point promptly at 7 pm. All walkers should be complete by 8:30 pm. Please be at the start point sufficiently before these times to get checked in by the scheduled start times.

From Highway 12 north in Middleton, turn right at Exit 250 to County M (Airport Rd which becomes Century Ave) and follow County M for about 3 miles. Turn left at County Q and follow County Q about ¾ mile to Indigo Way. Turn left on Indigo Way, then left on Sandhill, and finally left on Park Trail to the start point. Ample parking is available.

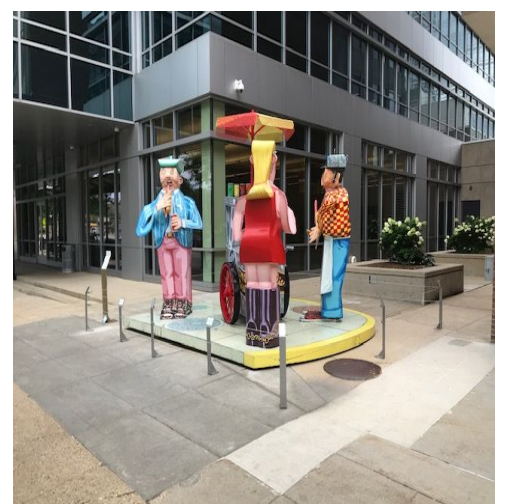
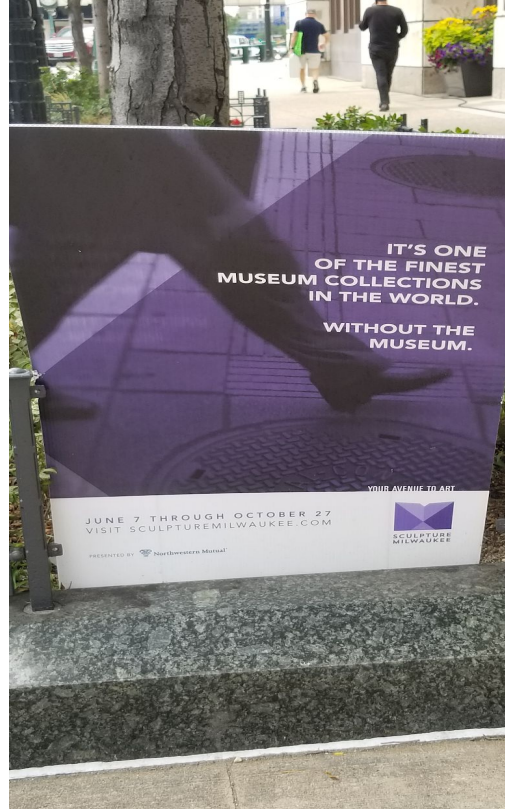
**Introducing Our New AVA Systems Volunteer

**Call to Order:** The meeting was called to order by President Doug Wiest at 6:05 p.m. The meeting's agenda was approved with the addition of the item, the 2021 AVA convention, in New Business. The minutes of the 8 May 2019 Board meeting were also approved as distributed.

### Unfinished Business

Newsletter Articles: Joanne Reuter will write about the Sunday October 13 trash pick up. She will also write an article updating people about any walks that will (be) changed to online start registration. Doug will post accomplishments (if published); Mary, membership updates and walk and eat events; Don, the Lake Farm Park and moonlight walks on September 15 and October 11.

YRE's for 2020; Use the On-line start box for selected ones?: Joanne proposed all outlying (outside of Dane County) walks be converted to online start registration. The number of affected walks is 12. The walks in Madison, Monona, Middleton and Deforest would still use the walk box system. This would save printing costs and POC time. Diane made a motion to this effect, which was seconded and approved unanimously.

Joanne will contact the AVA as soon as possible. Tom needs to know around mid-August, before walk descriptions are put on AVA website.

Electronic copies of the 2020 Blue Books: Because the mailed hard copy version of the annual blue book has also been the means for collecting dues, Mary will need to devise another way to manage this if a significant number are distributed electronically in the future instead. Diane pointed out that publishing cost for 500 2019 blue books was \$455.

After some discussion, Don moved that 200 copies of the blue book be printed for 2020. These would be used for start boxes, walk tables and information for other clubs. General membership will be provided electronic versions. The motion was seconded and approved unanimously.

It was also pointed out that Jerry would like a couple pages devoted to the Ice Age Trail walks in the next Blue Book. Such information will need to be provided to the Blue Book editor, Diane Thornbery.

Update to Bylaws: Joanne made a motion that discussion of this item be postponed to a future date, in light of more pressing concerns. The motion was seconded and approved.

### New Business

Year-round and Seasonal walks to continue for 2020: Topic included in above discussion re "YRE's for 2020".

Interest in a 25th anniversary photo contest?: It was generally agreed to postpone this subject to the August general membership meeting/picnic.

2021 AVA convention: Don said he was informed the 2021 AVA convention itself will be June 29, 30 and July 1, with pre- and post- walks extending beyond these dates. As done for the most recent convention, Don is willing to write 8 articles over time for The Wanderer. He added that he is in need of editorial and photographic support. Kristi agreed to proofread Don's articles before submission to the AVA. As far as photographic support, it was suggested Don check with the sports commission via Jerry and with the Madison Convention Bureau.

Russ Crane mentioned he will be obtaining the software that was developed for the Albany 2019 convention and will be able to adapt it for use in 2021. He indicated that leadership for the 2021 convention is needed in a number of different areas, probably with the formation of committees. Diane and Joanne offered to lead the silent auction committee.

Joanne suggested the 2021 convention be on the agenda of every future meeting prior to the event, and there may also be a need for special meetings.
