Get Ready for Walking in 2020 By Don Suloff

The 2020 Dairyland Walkers schedule has been completed and you are encouraged to break out those new calendars you have been receiving or your electronic devices and enter the walk dates so you don't miss any of these walks. We have a number of exciting new walks as well as some old favorites which you will want to join.

We start the year with three traditional walks that we have done for a number of years now in acceptance of Wisconsin winters. On January 11 we will walk in West Towne Mall to be followed by a walk in East Towne Mall on February 8. Our popular "Pie Walk" will occur in Middleton on March 14 – exactly "Pi" day this year!

We then begin the heart of our walking season with a walk in nearby Belleville on April 18 enjoying this community's parks and unique trails. On May 30 we will visit Sauk Prairie for a walk along the Wisconsin River and through town parks, perhaps seeing a bald eagle.

This year's walking weekend will occur on June 13 and 14 beginning at High Cliff State Park where we will follow a number of adventurous trails passing lime ovens, effigy mounds, and spectacular views of Lake Winnebago. On the 14th we will move over to Sheboygan for a new walk in this community through town and along Lake Michigan. On July 11 we will walk from Tenney Park to the Art Fair on the Square and back with sections along Lake Mendota and some historic homes.

We will have a first-time walk in Baraboo on August 22 enjoying this home of Circus World and numerous trails and parks. After a lapse of many years we will return to Monroe on September 19 to enjoy the community and the delights of Cheese Day.

The fall will feature a new walk in Milton on October 17 enjoying winding streets, historic Milton College, and Milton Junction where two railroads crossed paths in the 1850's. Our final event of the year will be our traditional Veteran's Walk on November 7.

Additional information will be on the club website for all of these events. Dairyland Walker events are recognized for the interesting areas visited and the excellence of our directions, yet 2019 was characterized by very disappointing attendance. Although reasons abound for not attending our events, lack of event support can be discouraging to those spending hours planning and staffing events which must be held when scheduled.
