Saturday Walk & Eat Group - March 9, April 4 and April 11 By Mary Liebig

DeForest Walk - March 9

We'll walk the year-round walk in DeForest on Saturday, March 7 that travels on paved sections of the Western Green Trail along the Yahara River, strolls through downtown DeForest and continues on the 10' wide porous asphalt Upper Yahara River Trail. I'll bring the walk box with registration materials and maps to Western Green Park.

Plan to meet at the Western Green Park Shelter located at 417 Acker Pkwy in DeForest at 8:45 a.m. (located between River Rd. and Main St) We'll start walking around 9 a.m. The Norske Nook located at 100 E. Holum St. in DeForest, will be the meeting spot for breakfast/lunch following the walk.

Capital Walk - April 4 during National Walking Week April 1-7, 2020

Note the change in the date for this walk which was originally scheduled for Saturday, March 28. The board of directors of America's Walking Club declared that the first seven days of April 2020 will be "National Walking Week!" and our club will participate by walking the Capitol Walk on Saturday April 4. Meet at the start point of the Capitol Walk, the Park Hotel (Inn on the Park), located at 22 South Carroll St. at around 8:45 a.m. to register for the walk, we'll start walking at 9 a.m. After the walk, we'll eat at the restaurant inside the Park Hotel, The Post.

Civil War Walk - April 11

The following week, Saturday morning April 11, will find us walking the Civil War Walk on the near west side of Madison. We'll meet at the start point of the Civil War Walk, the Best Western InnTowner, located at 2424 University Ave.at 8:45 a.m. to register for the walk and start walking at 9 a.m. It is worth noting that parking has been tight at the Best Western, so it may be helpful to park at our lunch location, the Blue Moon Bar & Grill at 2535 University Ave. The Blue Moon opens at 11 a.m. and should be able to accommodate our group.

Pan Pacific Walker Award - Cindy Haagensen By Jerry Wilson

Our own Cindy Haagensen received an award at the IML (International Marching League) awards ceremony on February 23rd in San Antonio TX. Cindy has walked in eight different Pan Pacific countries during IML events. The IML is "a non-political, non-profit organization whose purpose is to promote walking as a worthwhile and healthy recreation; and to foster international understanding and goodwill by encouraging participation at walking events in other countries through a program of incentive awards." Walking in Small Town America By Don Suloff

On April 18 we will move a short distance southwest of Madison to Belleville, which was first settled in 1845 by Swiss, Irish, and French groups. Our walk will pass between arms of Lake Belle on a beautiful walking trail, join the Badger State Trail for some distance, walk through city parks, and finish going through the historic section of Belleville.

Walkers may register between 8 am and noon and are requested to have completed the walk by 3 pm. To reach the start point from US Hwy 18/151 west of Madison, take exit 77 south on Hwy 69 for approximately 11 miles to Belleville. Just prior to crossing the Sugar River into the heart of the Village of Belleville, turn right into the Belleville Community Park and proceed counter clockwise to shelter #3.
