Strike One, Two, Three and Yer Out! Veteran's Weekend Walk - November 7 - CANCELED By Jerry Wilson

We have canceled our club traditional walk planned for Saturday, November 7. First we lost the starting point. The Park Hotel remains only open to lodgers. Next we lost our finish location. Plaza Tavern, like many businesses, is relegated to only 25% capacity, we could check-in there finishing the walk, and use the restrooms, but we couldn't stay inside where it is warm. The third strike was confirming that the Capitol Building is closed to the public for an undetermined amount of time. See the posted sign below. Being the Capitol Building is a major portion of the walk route and our backup location for restrooms near the walk start point we need to cancel this event.

Below is the waiver referred to in the article on page 3. If you would like to do a Dairyland Walkers year round or seasonal walk and want to receive the walk directions and map see the following steps:

- 1. E-mail Jerry Wilson at jpatw4@gmail.com as many days as possible before planning to walk a specific route:
 - a. Identifying which walk you wish to walk, and the distance desired (medium or short, or both).
 - b. Attach a completed and signed (Waiver) Official Event Start Card form: See Newsletter Attachment D.
- 2. A list will be compiled of walkers and shared with each POC. An email will be return to you with an attached copy of the walk directions to be completed when convenient for you. Either print the directions in advance or access directions on a smart phone when you begin to walk.
- 3. When walk boxes are again accessible, stop in, stamp your books, complete the registration log, an envelope, include payment and a copy of the submitted (waiver) Official Event Start Card and follow directions in each start box. If you no longer have a copy of the waiver start card, or could not print it at home, complete a new start card from the box. For walk boxes not located near you which may be difficult to visit later in 2020, we are talking about making 2020 stamps available at an early 2021 event or a couple of early 2021 events.
