## Westside Parks – September 12, Devil's Lake State Park – October 24

More Saturday Group Walk and Eat opportunities are coming up in September and October:

### September 12 Westside Parks 10k

Saturday morning, September 12, will find us walking the Madison Westside Parks walk. I'll bring the walk box with registration material and maps to Garner Park. Meet at the Garner Park Shelter located at 333 S Rosa Rd. in Madison (near Cuna Insurance off Mineral Point Road) at 8:45 a.m. to register for the walk; we'll start walking at 9 a.m.

After the walk we won't eat inside a restaurant, but those wishing to eat and visit after the walk may bring their own lunch and bag chair and we'll eat in Garner Park.

#### October 24 Devil's Lake State Park 10k

Catch some fall colors with a hike at Devil's Lake State Park in Baraboo on Saturday morning, October 24. I'll bring the Devil's Lake walk box to the start of the hike at the East Bluff trailhead since the visitor center is closed. The East Bluff trailhead is accessible from North Shore Rd, where the visitor center is located. From the visitor center, drive over the railroad tracks and take the first right into the overflow parking area. The East Bluff trailhead is located opposite the end of the second parking lot – look for the large, roofed kiosk. An annual park sticker is required to visit state parks and trails. Buy before you go, annual and daily passes are NOT available for purchase at the park.

Meet at 8:45 a.m. at the East Bluff trailhead to register for the walk, we'll start walking at 9 a.m. and again, not plan to eat inside a restaurant afterward. However, those wishing to eat and visit after the walk may bring their own lunch and bag chair and we'll eat in the park.

## Sauk Prairie Walk - September 19, 2020 By Jill Ruef

The Sauk Prairie area is full of wonderful history and some forgotten. The walk will start at the new River Side Park (alias August Derleth) in Sauk City. A good portion of the walk will take you along the updated Sauk Prairie River Trail which runs along the Wisconsin River. You will get a glimpse of the Dam and stroll along the river as it passes Eagle Island.

Did you know Cuca Records was the hottest record producing company in the Midwest during the 60's and 70's! Focus was on polka and ethnic music such as Mule Skinner Blues and In Heaven There is No Beer. They even turned down David Bowie due to polka commitments.

Park Hall (Freethinkers Hall) was constructed in 1884. They still do square dancing and hold Sunday services. The Celo Bottling Company bottled a drink called Polka Cola (as-well-as Sun Drop). The First Presbyterian in Prairie is the oldest church in Sauk County and the third oldest in the State of Wisconsin. They assume the Sauk City firehouse, built in 1862 it is probably the oldest fire station in the state.

Did I forget Culvers? Nope! Oh! And there's more. Saving them for when we see you in September.

- Send Jerry Wilson a completed and signed waiver form/start card (attachment D) and request that walk directions be emailed to you. To obtain the stamp for your books either 1.) send payment to Jerry Wilson and you will receive a scan of the stamp to print, cut and paste into your achievement books. or 2.) If you want to walk sooner rather than later, after you receive the emailed walk directions, walk the event and bring your achievement books to one of the four in-person events to make payment and stamp your books.

## Milton Walk - Saturday, October 17 By Dave and Kim Riyeff

All are invited to walk in Milton on Saturday, October 17th. Walkers can start between 8 AM and Noon, and finish by 3 PM. Milton shares in the rich history of southern Wisconsin. Originally known as Prairie du Lac, the town's beginnings date back to the late 1830's. The walk begins downtown at South Goodrich Park. We'll pass by the Milton House, the historic Inn built in the 1840's by Milton's founder, Joseph Goodrich. The very first poured grout building in the United States, Milton House also served as a recognized station on the Underground Railroad. A tunnel beneath the Inn provided a safe hiding place for former slaves seeking freedom.

The walk continues past the Northleaf Winery. We'll then make our way through neighborhoods, a city park prairie area, and then to Merchant's Row in Milton Junction. Milton Junction and Milton operated as separate communities until a merger in 1967. From "the Junction" we'll stroll past historic buildings on the campus of Milton College, founded in the 1840's. From there it's back into the neighborhood and a short stroll to the start point. Hope to see you then.
