The Convention Draws Near!! By Don Suloff

The 22nd Biennial AVA Convention in Madison is just around the corner with pre-convention walks in Galena, IL; Oconomowoc, Green Bay, and Sparta on June 26 thru 29; convention walks in Pheasant Branch, Monona Bay, and Olbrich Gardens on June 30 thru July 2; and a post-convention walk on State Street and through the UW Campus on July 3. Its now a time of excitement and nervousness as we anticipate showcasing our city and club to the Nation and worry about what could go wrong!

Our primary concern lies in having sufficient volunteers to properly staff the various events through the week. Each walk from June 26 to July 3 will require almost 40 volunteer shifts in positions ranging from parking lot attendees, to greeters, to registration table workers, to book stampers, to check-point staffers. Shift times needing staffing will vary from early morning to mid-afternoon each day and each shift runs about 3 hours. Convention activities also require considerable volunteer help ranging from convention registration, to merchandise sales, to staffing the silent auction site (this activity will require multiple volunteers on Tuesday evening through Saturday morning working 3 ½ hour shifts), to information tables. Clearly we can make this convention successful only if each of you will pitch in and help. Those willing to help on one or more convention walks should contact Don at suloff@tds.net indicating days and times you are willing to work and indicate job preference. Those willing to help at the convention at either the Concourse Hotel or Monona Terrace should contact Jerry at convention@ava.org indicating days and times you are willing to work and indicate job preference.

The convention is an exciting opportunity to see how our association operates and to meet walkers from around the country. All are encouraged to sign up and attend. However, if you are only interested in participating in the excellent selection of walks and rides being offered, walk in registration is available at each walk and/or ride. You need to be aware that there will not be a credit only option for these events. Each event will require a payment of \$10 per walker/rider and will include a patch unique to that event. The patches will provide special memories from our convention.

Modification to Dairyland Walkers Bylaws By Doug Wiest

At the Dairyland Walkers Membership meeting via ZOOM on 14 April 2021, the members in attendance voted to add Section 5 to Article IV with the following sentence:

"In unusual circumstances, such as when approval of an issue is desired before the next meeting date, a vote may be conducted via email."

Occasionally there is a circumstance where a decision is needed to be made which cannot be delayed until the next meeting of the board members, such as when a bill needs immediate attention. This modification to the Bylaws permits such an issue to be resolved promptly.

Dane County's Health Order for the Period Beginning May 5 Make Convention Gatherings Do-Able By Jerry Wilson

Dane County Health Order No. 16 will increase safe gathering numbers to sufficient maximum requirements to make things easier for the convention. And if trends continue the June Health Order (No. 16) should be even more flexible as more residents are vaccinated. Indoor gatherings increase to the maximum allowed to 350 people where foods and beverages are offered.
