### West Towne (January 15, 2022) and East Towne (February 12, 2022) Mall Walks By Terry Wendt

The West Towne walk will be held on Saturday January 15, 2022. The start point will be the Firestone Tire Store at 7105 Mineral Point Rd. Because the mall doesn't open until 10:00 AM we will start the walk at 9:45am until noon with all walkers finished by 2:00pm.

The East Towne walk will be held on Saturday February 12, 2022. The start point will be the Firestone Tire store at 4601 East Towne Blvd. Because the mall doesn't open until 10:00 AM we will start the walk at 9:45am until noon with all walkers finished by 2:00pm.

### Wednesday Morning Group Walks at West & East Towne Malls January/February By Mary Liebig

A new year brings a new walking program. Some of our members are available to walk on a weekday, so weekly group walks are scheduled at the East and West Towne Malls on Wednesday mornings in January and February. Both malls open at 9:45 a.m. now and allow walkers; masks are required inside the mall.

There is not much traffic inside the malls on weekday mornings, so I did not find it difficult to walk on a recent Wednesday morning between 9:45 a.m. and noon. There are lockers to leave coats in at both malls for a cost of .50 (two quarters) but not all of them are working properly.

Here is the schedule of weekly walks below on Wednesday mornings alternating between the West and East Towne malls each week. We'll meet inside at the Food Court of each mall at 9:45 a.m. to register and start walking. There is a \$3 fee for all participants, and both mall walks will count for AVA credit. A 5k (3 mile) walk is 4.5 laps around the mall, 10k (6 miles) is 9 laps around the mall.

## Retiring Board Members Recognized at December 5 Membership Meeting By Mary Liebig

Board members and volunteers are the lifeblood of the Dairyland Walkers; at the December 5 membership meeting, we recognized and thanked the following individuals who stepped down from the board in 2021:

#### Russ Crane

Russ joined the Dairyland Walkers in April 1996 and served the club in many capacities over that time. He served as Treasurer from 2001-2008, was the club Webmaster from 2003-2013, and managed the club's inventory of supplies as Stores Manager for the last twenty years.

Name the task, and Russ has probably done it for our club! He knows a lot about our parent organization AVA – America's Walking Club and has attended 10 AVA national conventions, serving as our club delegate at least 5 times. Recently Russ was integral in holding the 2021 AVA Convention in Madison, planning three walking routes for it. Russ was also the driving force in holding the 2014 North Central Regional Rendezvous at the John Wall Pavilion at Madison's Tenney Park, planning three walking routes for that event. Since the first walking route he planned at Devil's Lake State Park in 1999, Russ estimates that he has designed or completely modified 40 to 80 walks.

Russ was awarded a Lifetime Membership in the Dairyland Walkers, an honor reserved for only a handful of members for his 25 years of outstanding contributions.

#### Karen Reger

Karen also joined the Dairyland Walkers in April 1996, and has devoted countless volunteer hours to the club as well. She served as Secretary from 2001- 2009 and Publicity Director from 2007-2020.

Karen used her expertise in Microsoft Word to develop the gold standard of walking directions. If Russ has mapped routes for 40 to 80 walks, that means that Karen has written directions in Microsoft Word for that many walks! She has also served as the Point of Contact for the Madison Eastside year-round walk for the last 12 years.

Like Russ, Karen was also integral in holding the 2021 AVA convention in Madison, writing directions for three different convention walks. She served as project manager for the 2014 North Central Regional Rendezvous.

Karen was awarded a Lifetime Membership in the Dairyland Walkers for her 25 years of outstanding contributions.

#### **Diane Thornbery**

Diane first joined the Dairyland Walkers 24 years ago, and stepped down as Board Member at Large at the end of 2021, a position she held for the last three years. From 2014 – 2016, Diane served as the club Treasurer, during Kristi Kenyon's leave of absence.

Diane also planned walking routes for the club, one in the Nakoma neighborhood of Madison and another in Evansville. In 2017 she developed online storage of club documents like walking directions using Google Suites. Diane has served as the Point of Contact for the West Towne Mall, West Side Parks, and Arboretum walks.

Many members enjoyed the wine and cheese parties hosted by Diane and Joanne Reuter as we finished the county walking weekends.

Most recently Diane served as Silent Auction Co-Chair for the 2021 AVA National Convention.

#### Joanne Reuter

Joanne joined the club in June 2009, and finished her stint as the Sanctioned Walk Box Coordinator at the end of the year, a position she's held for the last six years. In 2015 Joanne served as Board Member at Large.

Joanne is known for Talk'n Trash, that is for the last 8 years she's coordinated trash pick-up twice a year for the 2-mile segment of US Highway 12/18 near Nora's II that the Dairyland Walkers adopted.

- 2. A list will be compiled of walkers and shared with each POC. An email will be return to you with an attached copy of the walk directions and map to be completed when convenient for you. Either print the directions in advance or access directions on a smart phone when you begin to walk.
