Fun and Fitness: The Dairyland Walkers will hold their traditional November walk this year on Saturday, November 6th. We start walking from a start point outside the Park Hotel, 22 S. Think Walking in 2022 !! By Don Suloff

As we begin receiving our 2022 Calendars, the Dairyland Walker event schedule should be among the first entries you will want to pencil in and here it is! The schedule will also be appearing on our website soon. With the ongoing changes occurring in our lives, play close attention to updating information in our club's emails since we never know when protocols will be changing!

Our year will start familiarly with mall walks in January and February starting at the Firestone Service Centers at West and East Towne Malls. The West Towne Mall walk will be on January 15th and the East Towne Mall walk will be on February 12th. Walk time will be different from previous years in recognition of mall opening hours. We will allow walkers to start between 10:00 a.m. and noon and complete their walks by 1:00 p.m. Also familiar will be our annual Pie Walk to be held on March 12th. This guided walk will begin promptly at 2:00 p.m., but will start at a new point. This year we will begin at the Middleton Public Library's Community Room (located between the Hubbard Avenue Diner and St. Luke's where we previously began our pie walks). As in the past we will enjoy a slice of pie following our walk. Unique to this walk is the fee – all participants will be charged \$5.

National Walking Week is from April 1 to April 8, 2022, and we will be participating to the extent weather permits! Rather than scheduling walks at this time, we are planning a series of guided walks, possibly on each day of the week. We will be employing AVA's new special Traveling Guided Event stamp which will allow us to reprise favorite walks from the area without having to pay a separate sanction fee. These walks will be advertised in the club's email distribution.

The heart of our walking season will begin with a walk in Verona on May 21st, followed by a walk in Waunakee on June 25th, and finishing with a walk in New Glarus on July 23. Each of these walks will have start times between 8:00 a.m. and noon, and will have an expected finish time of 3:00 p.m.

Our club's annual picnic will be Wednesday, August 10th at Lakeside Park in Middleton. Just prior to the picnic we will hold a guided walk using the Middleton stamp.

During the fall we will have a walk during the Monroe Cheese Days on September 17th (this walk has been delayed for several years now!), on Starkweather Creek in Madison on October 8th, and our annual Veteran's Walk in Madison on November 12th. The first two have our normal start and finish times, while the Veteran's Walk will begin between 9:30 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. and finish at a local eating establishment for those interested.

The year ends with our club Christmas party with a guided walk using a portion of the Eastside walk and that walk's stamp on December 4th.

On my annual trek to visit my best friend, I walked several interesting walks on the Lincoln highway on September 9, 10, and 11. The weather was spectacular. On September 9, I did the Valparaiso 10k walk enjoying the Valparaiso University campus at the beginning and end.

The next day I broke my record - 1-10k walk and 5-5k walks. The first walk was in Plymouth, Indiana which is one of my favorite Indiana walks. The start point presents a wonderful array of desserts to enjoy at the beginning or end! The walk starts through a park, goes by several schools, and then by the Plymouth county building which is such a beautiful building.

Then on to Winona Lake which is a resort area. This walk was available via the OSB which was nice since the start point has limited hours. At the start of this walk, you go by this canal and then this interesting buffalo appears on the route. There are a lot of local shops to visit. There is a 10k and 12k walk that takes you to Grace College.

Columbia City was my next walk adventure, which I've done every year for the past 15 years. There are many interesting sites on this walk - a beautiful mural, Smith & Sons funeral home which is 170 years old, a haunted house, and another beautiful county building.

Then my friend joined me for the Fort Wayne, Indiana - Hall's Drive-in walk. The two workers at the start point had no idea that this walk existed so hopefully they check out the Three River Stollers walk club. This walk passes through very beautiful old neighborhoods, with this home being one of my favorites, and another picturesque mural.

On Saturday my friend and I made a 100 mile trek to check out the Indy 'G' walkers special event walk in Sheridan, Indiana. We were graciously greeted by the members who created this walk and happy to support this club being walkers number 19 and 20. We learned that their club has dwindled to 30 members due to many members passing away. On the route, we visited the historical museum which was opened specifically for the walkers and learned that Sheridan was the Swiss cheese producing capital of the world in 1850.
