Capitol Walk Box Has a New Home - The Concourse Hotel, 1 W. Dayton Street, Madison By Jerry Wilson

The WI Capitol Walk Box, beginning February 15th.will be hosted by The Concourse Hotel, 1 W. Dayton Street, Madison. I dropped the walk box off with the desk manager and we discussed the "care and feeding", or rather the storage and availability of the walk box. The box will be available 24 hours a day. To begin with, the box will be located just past the front desk, down a short hall on the left-side visible on the bottom shelf of a podium stored permanently in that hall, a staircase is on your right-side.

Keven Moore has updated the Dairyland Walkers website, and Patrick Jones has updated the event listing on AVA.org.

Vehicle parking will be similar to the old location. Most parking is paid parking on-the-street or in one of many parking ramps near the Capitol Square. I suggest the, formerly called Carroll St. Ramp, now with a posted name "State Street - Capitol". It is located between the corner of E. Johnson and N. Carroll Streets, and the corner of N. Carroll and W. Dayton Streets. The start point is "kitty-corner" from this parking ramp. If you have walked the Veterans Weekend Walk in past Novembers, this is the parking lot I have recommended. The Hotel also has pay parking, but it is often limited to lodgers.

Hint: Street parking is at no cost on Sunday's and city recognized legal holidays in downtown Madison.

The Hotel has restrooms available, they are located to the rear of the lobby area, walk towards the hotel's bar, called "The Bar", use the short hall labeled "Elevators to reach a drinking fountain and the restrooms Until exhausted we will use the existing supply of 10 km walk directions remaining from 2021, with a slight deviation from the new start and to the finish. Look for new directions this Spring.

Our annual Pie Walk is just around the corner and you'll want to make your reservations now. This is one of few walks that we conduct where we request reservations. This is necessary in order to properly order the pies for the post-walk indulgence! And this year we will be back indoors as opposed to starting in the parking lot like last year!

On Saturday, March 12th (close to 3.14) we will meet at St. Luke's Lutheran Church at 7337 Hubbard Avenue in Middleton for a guided 5K walk, followed by a slice of Hubbard Avenue Diner pie for each participant. The walk will depart St. Luke's at precisely 2:00 pm with all registration needing to be completed prior to that time. Morning Group Walks in March By Mary Liebig

Arboretum-March 2, Wednesday a.m. Madison Eastside-March 9, Wednesday a.m. DeForest-March 19, Saturday a.m.

After walking inside the East and West Towne Malls in January and February (except for our Snowshoe event at Elver Park) it's time to think spring and offer some outside group walking opportunities in March. We'll start out with shorter (5k) walking routes on the first two Wednesday morning walks, thinking that icy or snow-covered sidewalks may still be a possibility in early March. Those interested may stay for lunch or coffee following these walks.

Wednesday March 2 Arboretum 5k

Plan to meet at the start point of this walk, inside Colectivo Coffee, located at 2530 Monroe St. in Madison at 9:45 a.m. to register for this walk; we'll start walking at 10 a.m.

Wednesday March 9 Madison Eastside 6k

On Wednesday morning, March 9, instead of meeting at the start point at Monty's Blue Plate Diner, we'll meet in the Olbrich Botanical Gardens north parking lot, at a picnic table near the children's playground equipment. The address is 3330 Atwood Avenue, and I will have the registration/maps located there.

Meet at 9:45 a.m. to register; we'll start walking at 10 a.m.

Saturday March 19 DeForest Walk 10k

We'll walk the year-round walk in DeForest on Saturday, March 19 that travels on paved sections of the Western Green Trail along the Yahara River, strolls through downtown DeForest and continues on the 10' wide porous asphalt Upper Yahara River Trail. I'll bring the walk box with registration materials and maps to Western Green Park. If anyone would like to lead the 6k route, let me know and I will get that information out in an email.

Plan to meet at the Western Green Park Shelter located at 417 Acker Pkwy in DeForest at 8:45 a.m. (located between River Rd. and Main St) We'll start walking around 9 a.m.

National Walking Week By Don Suloff

The Board of Directors of the American Volkssport Association has proclaimed the first seven days of April as National Walking Week. With the uncertainty of Wisconsin's weather in early April, the Dairyland Walkers have chosen not to sanction a special walk for this period, but we plan to make it a special week anyway!

We now have a Traveling Guided Event stamp which enables us to hold impromptu walks and stamp books with this stamp for any number of walks. The Dairyland Walkers will hold walks during as many of the days of the first seven days of April as the weather permits. #NationalWalkingWeek April 1-7

The Dairyland Walkers plan to participate in National Walking Week in a big way in 2022! In January 2020, the Board of Directors of the AVA: America's Walking Club declared the first seven days of April to be "National Walking Week" which would include the traditional "National Walking Day" sponsored by the American Heart Association from 2007 to 2019. Many AVA clubs throughout the United States will be participating

Join the Dairyland Walkers as we repeat our post 2021 National Convention walk featuring the UW Campus on Saturday, April 2 starting from the Concourse Hotel at 1 W Dayton St. The nearest parking is at the formerly named Carroll St. Ramp, now with a posted name "State Street - Capitol" ramp located across the street from the Concourse Hotel. We will not need to battle Farmer's Market attendees for parking; the downtown Farmer's Market will not open until mid-April.

Walkers will register, pay a \$3 participation fee, and those wishing to "stamp for credit" will do so inside the lobby of the Concourse Hotel at 9:45 a.m. Restrooms are available in the lobby. We hope to have all walkers on the trail by 10:15 a.m.

Both 10k and 6k routes will be offered that showcase much of the UW Campus including Alumni Park, Bascom Hill and Camp Randall. The 10k walk includes a long stretch on the Lakeshore Path and Allen Centennial Gardens as well. All walkers will be given a map and directions for their walk and are free to walk on their own; there is no "Finish Table" to check back to at the end of the walk. For those wishing to have lunch following their walk, we may eat at the Plaza Tavern located at 319 North Henry St. They open at noon on Saturdays.
