## Veteran's Week Walk - Saturday, November 12, 2022 By Jerry Wilson

Fun and Fitness, Honor the American Veteran: The Dairyland Walkers will hold their traditional November walk on Saturday, November 12th honoring military veterans. We start walking from the Concourse Hotel, at 1 W. Dayton St., Madison, the home to the WI Capitol Walk start box. The start point will be open 9:30 - 11:30am. 10K walkers can begin once registered, but we encourage starting around 10:00am at the earliest. The finish point opens no earlier than 12:00pm Noon for food and bar service. They may let us in a little earlier than Noon if the cleaning crew is finished. 5K walkers should start around 10:30 or a little later.

The finish table will be open at Plaza Tavern, 319 N. Henry St., Madison, in the backroom a little after 12:00pm Noon. Please finish by 1:30pm. Shops and restaurants along State St. will be open to return to after checking in at the finish table!

While walking, if it is cold outside, please take advantage of the warmth of the Capitol building, Veterans Museum, Chazen Museum, the Memorial Union and the Finish location. Friendship and Food: Come early and purchase coffee at Starbucks inside the Concourse Hotel, or plan lunch after finishing the walk, along State Street, around the Capitol Square area or at Plaza Tavern. This will also be the last Saturday Farmers Market for 2022, hours: 6:15am - 1:45pm.






# #OptOutside Arboretum Walk Friday, November 25 By Mary Liebig

Both malls open at 10 a.m. on weekdays.

Hello Dairyland Walker Friends! Kristi Kenyon here – your Dairyland Walkers Store Manager.

Just a friendly reminder that our Store has many of the supplies you need!

Orange 2022 Dairyland Walkers coupons are available to be used in 2022 for any of our 22 Year-Round and Seasonal walks. A sheet is \$20 for 8 coupons – a savings of \$4 when you use your whole sheet! Make sure to use yours by 12/31/2022.

The Store also has AVA books for Event (Green 1-50 events, Purple 51-600, Rose 601-1500, Gold 1500+), Distance (Blue 1-8000 km, Orange 8001-22000, Yellow 22000+), and Bike (Brown). These books are \$6 each. Walking the States and Walking the Capitals books are also available for \$5. Dairyland Walkers VIP books are free!

Dairyland Walkers Walking the Counties of Wisconsin books are also free! For those aiming to complete all 72 Wisconsin Counties, the Store has County stickers. These stickers are \$2 each and are only good in the Dairyland Walkers County program book, not the AVA books.

## All Dairyland Walkers Seasonal and Year Round (YR) Walks. By Jerry Wilson

We have a total of 22 Dairyland Walkers walks, seven are YR walks, fifteen are seasonal walks. Twenty-one walks are still available for walking in November and December. The only exception is the Lake Geneva route that traditionally closes after October 31st. Get out there and walk!

#### All AVA Wisconsin (WI) Ice Age Trail (IAT) Walks, By Jerry Wilson

There are sixteen AVA WI IAT walks available for you to walk through December in Wisconsin. Registration is via the On-line Start Box (OSB). These walks are established under the auspices of the AVA Regional Director, and not under the Dairyland Walkers, at the decision of the Dairyland Walkers. I recommend participants wear hunters neon orange beginning in September when various hunting seasons begin, through December each year. Also, be reminded these routes are more hikes than walk, only small portions of some of the routes are on roads, municipal streets or sidewalks. Hiking boots are recommended.

## Save the Dates!! - 2023 By Don Suloff

#### SAVE THE DATES!!

As we begin receiving our 2023 Calendars, the Dairyland Walker event schedule should be among the first entries you will want to pencil in and here it is! The schedule will also be appearing on our website soon. Support your club, enhance your health, and plan to walk each of the 2023 events!

Our year will start familiarly with mall walks in January and February starting at the Firestone Service Centers at West and East Towne Malls. The West Towne Mall walk will be on January 14 th and the East Towne Mall walk will be on February 11 th . We will allow walkers to start between 10:00 a.m. and noon and complete their walks by 1:00 p.m.

Also familiar will be our annual Pie Walk to be held on March 11 th. This guided walk will begin promptly at 2:00 p.m., but will start at a new point. This year we will begin at the Middleton Public Library's Community Room (located between the Hubbard Avenue Diner and St. Luke's where we previously began our pie walks). As in the past we will enjoy a slice of pie following our walk. Unique to this walk is the fee – all participants will be charged \$5.

National Walking Week is from April 1 to April 8, 2022, and we will be participating to the extent weather permits! Rather than scheduling walks at this time, we are planning a series of guided walks, possibly on each day of the week. We will be employing AVA's Traveling Guided Event stamp which will allow us to reprise favorite walks in the area without having to pay a separate sanction fee. These walk will be advertised in the club's email distribution.

The heart of our walking season will begin with a walk Evansville on May 20 th, reprising a walk of eight years ago and passing many colorful barn quilts. We then turn to Sun Prairie on June 17 th after another long absence, followed by a new walk in Greendale on July 15 th which will view many of the city's trademark chimneys. Each of these walks will have start times between 8:00 a.m. and noon, and will have an expected finish time of 3:00 p.m.

Our club's annual picnic will be August 16 th at Lakeside Park in Middleton. Just prior to the picnic we will hold a guided walk using the Middleton stamp.

On September 15-17 Dairyland Walker members are encouraged to participate in the North Central Regions "Choose Your Own Walk" program sponsored by the Iowa Club.

Next will be a new walk in Cherokee Marsh on October 7 which will also support Dane County's Walktober Program, followed by our annual Veteran's Walk in Madison on November 11 th . The Cherokee Marsh walk will have start times between 9 a.m. and noon with a requested finish no later than 3 p.m., while the Veteran's Walk will begin between 9:30 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. and finish at a local eating establishment after noon for those interested.

The year ends with our club Christmas party with a guided walk using a portion of the Eastside walk and that walk's stamp on December 3rd.

I hope to see each of you at most (if not all!) of these events.

## BEAVER MOON WALK WILL BE HELD Wednesday, November 9, 2022

## Walk the Fridley Rice Creek Trails

Walk on paved and natural trails along Rice Creek in Locke County Park.

Directions to Park: From I-694 east or west, take Exit 37 north (University Ave NE) to 69th Ave NE. Right on 69th Ave NE curving left to roundabout where you take the 2<sup>nd</sup> exit onto University Service Rd. Turn Right at 71st NE (just after passing fire and police station on right). Stay on 71st NE to its end and park next to the LARGE shelter. We will meet there at 6:15 to register and will start walking at 6:30pm.

Why the "Beaver" moon? This time of year, when beavers begin to take shelter in their lodges, having laid up sufficient stores of food for the long winter ahead. During the time of the fur trade in North America, it was the season to trap beavers for their thick winter-ready pelts.

# Open Letter About the 2023 IVV Olympiad and/or IML-San Antonio, TX Forwarded By Jerry Wilson

Hello

I have just returned from San Antonio last weekend where more than 20 dedicated volunteers and staff of *America's Walking Club* met for three days on our upcoming IVV Olympiad and IML Texas Trail Roundup events, 19-26 Feb 2023.

As we approach the holiday season, there are 550 people now pre-registered, with 400+ Americans, 50 Canadians and about 100 from the rest of the world - a total of 21 Nations. We have participants from 37 US states in all 10 AVA regions, and *we're not done!* We are still offering *passes* - either IVV, IML or the "combo" at the \$155.00 early-bird rate *until 30 November*. Additionally, we are now taking requests for *single-day passes*, at \$30/day per person.

These two international festivals back-to-back represent a once-in-a-generation cultural experience that we are bringing to the United States and North America for the first time. AVA recently joined IVV Americas & Oceania - and our partners in Canada and Australia are both participating! For American who have not had the opportunity to travel to previous Olympiads - it will be right here at home where you can drive or fly; and for our friends from the rest of the world - it's an opportunity for us to show them some uniquely American culture & traditions - such as the world-renowned San Antonio Stock Show and Rodeo.

We are lining up some first-class venues and entertainment for both festivals. Our "Olympic Village" - open throughout, will be at La Villita Historic Arts Village - in the heart of downtown. Here, we'll bring the world to the people of San Antonio, and our Pass holders will have exclusive access to special spaces both indoors and outside - weather dependent. We'll have a real volkssporting Start Halle - like you may remember from Germany, or even club walks in the past. Plenty of seating and refreshments for gathering socially and relaxing after your morning walk. >could say more/different things here as well<

Our trails are more urban in character, as they start / finish in the downtown (at the LaQuinta) - a decision we made early on. We're going to show the participants neighborhoods all around the city, with the cooperation of the Chamber of Commerce and cultural partners in different neighborhoods. Along the way you'll experience historic buildings and sites with expressive murals everywhere reflecting the rich history and culture here. You'll also encounter a variety of green spaces along the way - city parks and the extensive river/creek trail network are integrated into our routes. And along with 5/10 K distances, there are *longer walks* - several different 21km trails and two different marathon (42km) routes will be offered. The Saturday 2/25 IML events feature the historic "Spanish missions" trail, with UNESCO World Heritage sites. Also on tap - three days of bike rides and two days of swimming and a beautiful swim center - with transportation provided from the hotel to get you to the pool. With the City still opening back up after the pandemic, there has been a flurry of new / deferred construction. Our trailmasters are working hard to adapt to changing conditions and keep all the events safe and enjoyable!

Speaking of the work involved, as you can imagine it is extensive. We will need a couple hundred volunteers in the end to make this thing happen. And we have a great start with attendees signing-up to help with everything from trail marking to book stamping to carrying a sign in the Parade of Flags. However, volunteers are still needed, and *your help* is greatly appreciated. Two areas we are specifically looking for are (1) volunteers with specific language skills that could help international attendees (2) club trailmasters that are familiar with AVA standard marking techniques and come in and assist the trails team. Our fantastic Volunteer Coordinator, Susan Pinneke (famous from the 2011 AVA Convention in Iowa) is the person you'll talk to - just use that "volunteer here" button on the Olympiad website.

If you are unable to attend with us in February 2023, we ask you for your *financial support*. The facilities we've described, in a major American city with the need for security and post-pandemic inflation effecting everything - means we are looking for every dollar we can find. We are leveraging all our existing and new partners and sponsors, and having some success with those efforts. These festivals are not part of the normal AVA operating budget, and we want to show the international IVV and IML communities - and, all of you, *the best we have to offer.* Most of us will never do this again, so we are "all in." Your assistance is greatly appreciated.
