Choose Your Own Adventure - September 15 - 17 - - No Sept. Dairyland Walkers Traditional Event By Jerry Wilson

Typically local clubs are asked to not request certification for AVA walks within the region during a planned regional convention or walking adventure, and regional directors are asked to try to avoid approving walks during these periods. To this end there is no traditional Dairyland Walkers event in September.

We hope to see many Dairyland Walkers at the North Central Region Adventure Weekend September 15-17 when the North Central Region holds a weekend of walking, socializing, meeting, and fun. The northwest lowa town of Rock Valley will host the event. Nine walking events are available for each participant to choose their own adventure with five of them featured with start tables in the three days. In addition, there is a pizza party with games, a plated dinner with meeting and a multitude of prizes.

Saturday October 7 - Cherokee Marsh North Traditional Walk By Karen Reger & Russell Crane

On October 7, 2023, the Dairyland Walkers will be hosting a walk in the Cherokee Marsh Conservation Park, North Unit, located at the very end of North Sherman Avenue on Madison's north side.

Cherokee Marsh, Dane County's largest wetland, is located at the head of the chain of Yahara lakes.

Cherokee Marsh Conservation Park - North Unit is one piece in a complex of protected lands that support diverse wildlife and native plant communities in the marsh and adjacent uplands. The North Unit is 946 acres and has 4.1 miles of trails that explore restored prairie, oak savanna, and woodland. Boardwalks with observation decks offer views of the upper Yahara River, deep marsh, and sedge meadow.

The walk will be split into two 5Ks. One 5K will go through prairies and wetlands, along the newly renovated Cherokee Country Club golf course which will become TPC Wisconsin (a Tournament Players Club course), and into a residential area. Along the return route you will be walking alongside the Upper Yahara River and into more prairies.

The second 5K route is entirely within the park and will take you to several observation points, pass two conical effigy mounds, through a forest, and more prairies and wetlands.

The starting point will be adjacent to the parking lot and the restrooms. Registration will be from 9:00am to noon, with walkers finishing by 3:00pm.

VIP Program By Kristi Kenyon


Just a reminder to continue walking and stamping your VIP book as you do all the Dairyland Walker Year-Round and Seasonal walks. Starting this year, we have changed the program so you may participate in the VIP program unlimited times. You would need to complete all 22 walks for the first two books, then all 22 walks again for the second two books, etc. Once a book is completed, you receive a free IVV/AVA Event or Distance book of your choice, a \$6 value. So far in 2023, we've had 8 folks redeem VIP Books, giving away 14 free IVV/AVA books. Will you be next?

Eager to earn your VIP in 2023? Pick up a bright green 2023 VIP book at most Traditional and group events, in Year-Round/Seasonal boxes, or contact Kristi Kenyon. County Walking Program By Kristi Kenyon

In 2007, the Dairyland Walkers began the "Thomas M. Doyle Walking the Counties of Wisconsin" program. By 2018 the club had offered at least one walk in each of Wisconsin's 72 counties. Each finisher receives an embroidered patch and certificate of completion. This program is still on-going and available to all members. Hopefully you all have a light brown "Walking the Counties of Wisconsin" program book. The club has a library of all past walks available for those wishing to make-up a county already walked. Although the directions might be a little dated and some will be more difficult without directional arrows, with a little understanding and flexibility, all should be fine. We do recommend to walk with at least one other person if at all possible. Make-up walks will not be sanctioned, so AVA books cannot be stamped; however, we have special stick-on strips to be placed in the county walking booklets for recording your walk. To help offset the costs incurred by the club to manage these make-up walks, we request a \$2 donation to the club for each such walk completed. To obtain maps for any county, contact our trailmaster, Don Suloff at suloff@tds.net. To obtain a "Walking the Counties of Wisconsin" program book or the county stickers, contact our stores manager, Kristi Kenyon, at kensinginn@tds.net or find her at events. When the booklet is complete, turn in to Kristi Kenyon to receive your patch and certificate.
