Dairyland Walkers 30th Anniversary Walk, by Karen Reger

Thirty years ago, the Madison Area Volkssport Association (aka Dairyland Walkers) was chartered as a member club of the American Volkssport Association. In recognition of this event, a 5K/10K walk will be held on Saturday, September 13, on the North Side of Madison. It will start from the Warner Park Beach area located at 1101 Woodward Drive, next to Lake Mendota. Street parking is available on the side next to the shelter, and in the parking lot for beachgoers. Registration will be from 9:00 a.m. to noon; walkers must finish by 3:00 p.m.

The 5K will go through residential areas and a county park, which surrounds what used to be a tuberculosis sanitarium. The 10K will start and end the same as the 5K, but will go further north into a section of the Cherokee Marsh Conservation Park - South Unit.

Unfortunately, the shelter at Warner Park Beach had already been reserved, but there are open spaces that we should be able to use. You may want to bring lawn chairs, and we will provide tables for registration and treats. In case of rain, we may have to use the club's tent.

Walkbox Point of Contact Opening, by Chris Flessert

We have an opening for a walk box point of contact for the Oshkosh and Fond du Lac walks. Both walks are seasonal from April 1 through December 31 of each year. The walk box point of contact ensures that there are adequate directions and supplies in the walk box, gathers the start cards and payments, and submits a quarterly financial report to the treasurer with frequent walker coupons and payments. This position would involve traveling to Oshkosh and Fond du Lac four times a year. You would work with the current business to confirm that they will continue to host our walk box.
